The ServiceWA app is the fastest and most convenient way to claim the payment.

If you are unable to claim the WA Student Assistance Payment through the ServiceWA app you can submit a <u>claim online</u> or by posting in a <u>claim form</u>.

Claims made through these methods will take longer to process—up to 30 days—and are less secure than applying through ServiceWA.

Download the latest version of the ServiceWA app and log in with your Digital Identity (myGovID) so you're ready to apply for the offer from 15 April 2024.


