SCHOOL UNIFORM

Over the cooler months, we begin to see an array of different outfits being worn to school. The following statement comes from our Uniform Policy and we are requesting that students present to school in the required school uniform or Royal Blue colours.

ALL STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO WEAR UNIFORMS

This means that any students accepting enrolment in this school are expected to wear our uniform unless there are special circumstances which have been negotiated with the Principal at the time of enrolment.

"Acceptance of enrolment at a school assumes an agreement between the school, the parent/guardian and the enrolling student that the student will dress within the guidelines of the school dress code. If the dress code is unacceptable, parents have the right to apply for admission to a school where the dress code reflects their preference.'

Department of Education Policy

SCHOOL DRESS REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A policy of "no hat, no play" applies at all times
- 2. Closed in shoes to be worn for safety reasons, and at all times for Physical Education and Sport. Appropriate secure sandals may be worn for all other activities. Shoes such as boots, slip-on sandals, crocs and thongs are not acceptable safe footwear for school.
- 3. Students must not wear any additional items for clothing which are not part of the school uniform eg bicycle pants, leggings, check shirts, denim, footy jumpers. Leggings may be worn if Royal or Navy Blue in colour.
- 4. No jewellery other than studs/sleepers in ears and a watch may be worn.
- 5. No make-up including nail polish and spray on hair colour.
- 6. For health and safety reasons, all long hair (boys and girls) must be tied back.
- 7. Students to remove over-jackets worn for extra warmth during the colder months when inside the classroom.

The Uniform:

The uniform is as follows

- Royal Blue school Polo-shirt with school crest.
- Royal Blue school windcheater with school crest.
- Royal Blue shorts/blue skorts.
- Royal blue sports skirts
- Royal Blue tracksuit pants or Royal Blue Cargo pants

Second hand uniforms are available.
